POLYTECHNIC COURSES

The entry requirement in Polytechnic is a pass out student in class 10.

The Polytechnic courses are thoroughly job-oriented, vocation-based Courses. They are of three years duration. They are available in both Engineering and other general streams. The candidates coming out successfully from the Polytechnic Colleges are employed as Supervisor Trainees, foreman trainees or technician trainees in industrial establishments and Government Departments dealing with roads and buildings, electricity, water, Public health and sanitation etc.

Polytechnic Training just one step below the first degree educational Programs may be seen as belonging to outside the school and University system. The Diploma holders are eligible to study First degree Courses in engineering and technology. Polytechnics have been set up both by the governments and Private Agencies. Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka have the highest no. of polytechnics in the country. There are separate Polytechnics for women in several States

There is also 4-year diploma Course in tool and die making offered by several Tool Room centre established in collaboration with Germany and Denmark. (Indo-Danish and indo-German Tool rooms)

Besides the general Polytechnics, there are specialized , State-wide Polytechnics in rare subjects like Printing Technology, leather Technology, Tool engineering ,etc. too.

All the polytechnics are under the control of the State Directors of Technical education at the State level. They are governed by the All India Council for Technical Education, New Delhi.

The Government of Andhra Pradesh conducts a State level entrance Exam for admission to this course in May every year. It is called POLYCET. The students desirous of studying Polytechnic Courses in any line should be good at Mathematics, Sciences and English; they must be physically agile and free from any eyesight deficiencies. They must be willing to relocate to Industrial Centers away from their homes.

Admissions into polytechnic courses will be based on the Polycet rank of the students. Rankers have to give their options through web counseling from 1st June to 7th June. Polycet Seats will be allotted to the students on 10-06-2013. The students who are allotted seats must report to their colleges on 14-06-2013. Classes will commence from the 14-06-2013.

Polytechnic course fee:

Fee for polytechnic courses in Government colleges is Rs. 3,800, and in private colleges the fee is Rs. 15,500. Those who have parental income less than 1lakh come under fee reimbursement no need to pay fees at admission time.
