## **STATE GOVERNMENT JOBS**

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### **TYPES OF JOBS**

State Government Jobs are of seven types:

- i) Cadre Posts, i.e posts relating to the IAS, IPS and IFS, for which Officers are, allotted to a State by the UPSC and Central Government
- ii) Gazetted Posts of the rank of Joint Director and below, including  
District –level Gazetted Posts, which are filled on the principle of direct recruitment by public notification in the mass media, through a Competitive Exam conducted by the AP Public Service Commission; which is commonly known as Group I Services Exam.
- iii) Non-Gazetted Posts in the Departments of Secretariat which are filled by public notification in the mass media ,through a Competitive Examination conducted by the AP Public Service Commission ; which is commonly known as Group II Examination.
- iv) Non-Gazetted posts in offices of Heads of Department in Hyderabad Headquarters which are filled on the principle of direct recruitment, by public notification in the mass media, through a

Competitive Examination conducted by the AP Public service Commission; which is generally known as Group II or II /A Examination.

v) Non-Gazetted Posts in offices of Heads of offices at District level

And below, which are filled on the basis of direct recruitment by public notification in the Mass media through a competitive examination conducted by the notified District Selection Committees which are headed by the district collector concerned: which Exam is generally known as DSC Test

vi) Class IV employees at all the Offices, which are filled by a local notification in the Press or through an Outsourcing agency.

vii) Posts of Drivers in all the offices, which are filled by a notification in the local press.

Out of all the above posts, the matriculates are eligible only for the posts of Attainder / Watchmen /Class IV posts.

It may be noticed that all these Departments of the State Government are Subject-specific and professional. The Matriculates have chances of employment in the lower posts of Attenders, Watchmen etc only. They may be employed in similar posts of Technical nature if they have the licence or required skill.

## **STATE GOVERNMENT AT THE DISTRICT AND MANDAL LEVEL:**



It must be stated here that this set up of Dept., may go down up to Mandal level or village level ,depending on the services provided by the Department.

For example, at district level the District Collector ( an IAS Officer) is the administrative head of the district. He is ably aided by a Superintendent of Police ( an IPS Officer). Other district Heads of Offices which exist at the district level with deeper machinery are District Judge,

Assistant Director, Marketing,

Assistant Director, Sericulture

Assistant Director, Survey

Assistant Commissioner, Endowments,

Assistant Commissioner, Labor

Assistant Controller, Legal Metrology,

Assistant director, handlooms,

Assistant Director, Mines and Geology,

The candidates can visit the district Headquarters and notice how the different offices are located at different places.

### **GETTING JOB HERE:**

Candidates must keep in touch with these Departments in their vicinity and get to know the recruitment method and skills required. They must prepare accordingly and apply for the post when advertized. They may keep in touch with the outsourcing agencies also.

**One thing which must be remembered is that knowledge of TELUGU is quite essential for getting the State Government job.**

It must be remembered that a State government servant is a government Servant for 24 hours. He enjoys special immunity when at work. Those who die in harness are either compensated properly or their dependents offered job. They get medical expenses reimbursement facility. They get pension under new scheme on retirement the age of retirement for Class IV posts is 60 years.

Reservations are available for different communities. Women applicants enjoy 33 1/3 % reservations in State Government jobs. The age-limit is 18-28 for uniform jobs and 18-34 for other jobs.

State Government service is strictly governed by the AP Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules 1990 and AP Conduct Rules, 1960. Candidates are advised to be punctual, disciplined, impartial and thoroughly faithful and devoted to the Government when at work.

The Class IV jobs are District based and are transferable anywhere within the District. The candidates can join the job and pursue further studies either in the evening or through Distance education, but only with the prior permission of the office where they are employed.

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
