This is the best rank secured by any Muslim

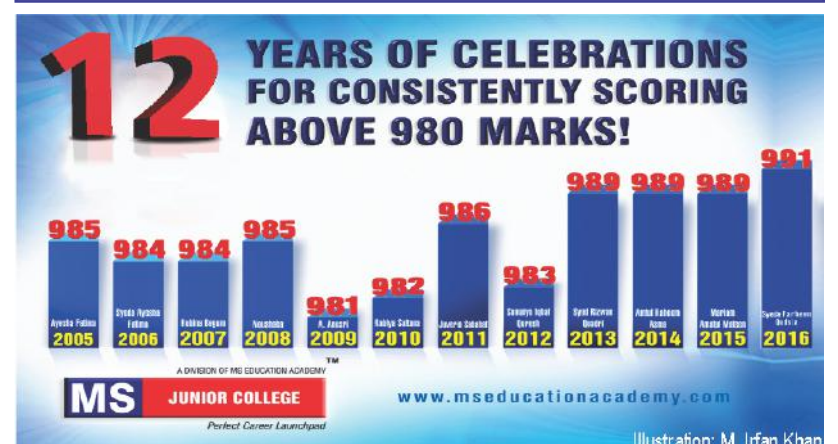
student in the history of UCEED.

think big and do not get stuck in petty things. He exhorted the teachers to realise their importance and upgrade themselves to meet the

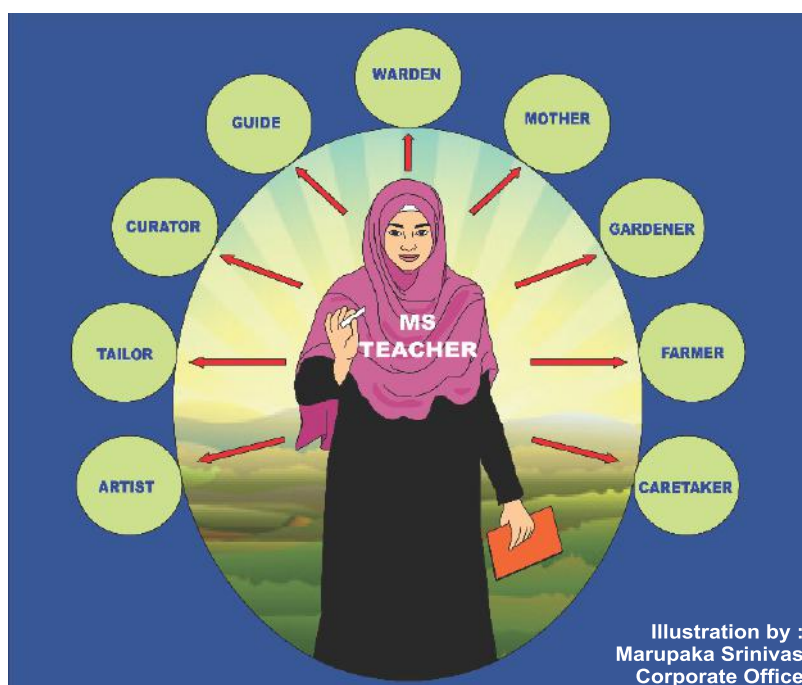

up! Roared the troll, but the third billy goat gruff rushed at

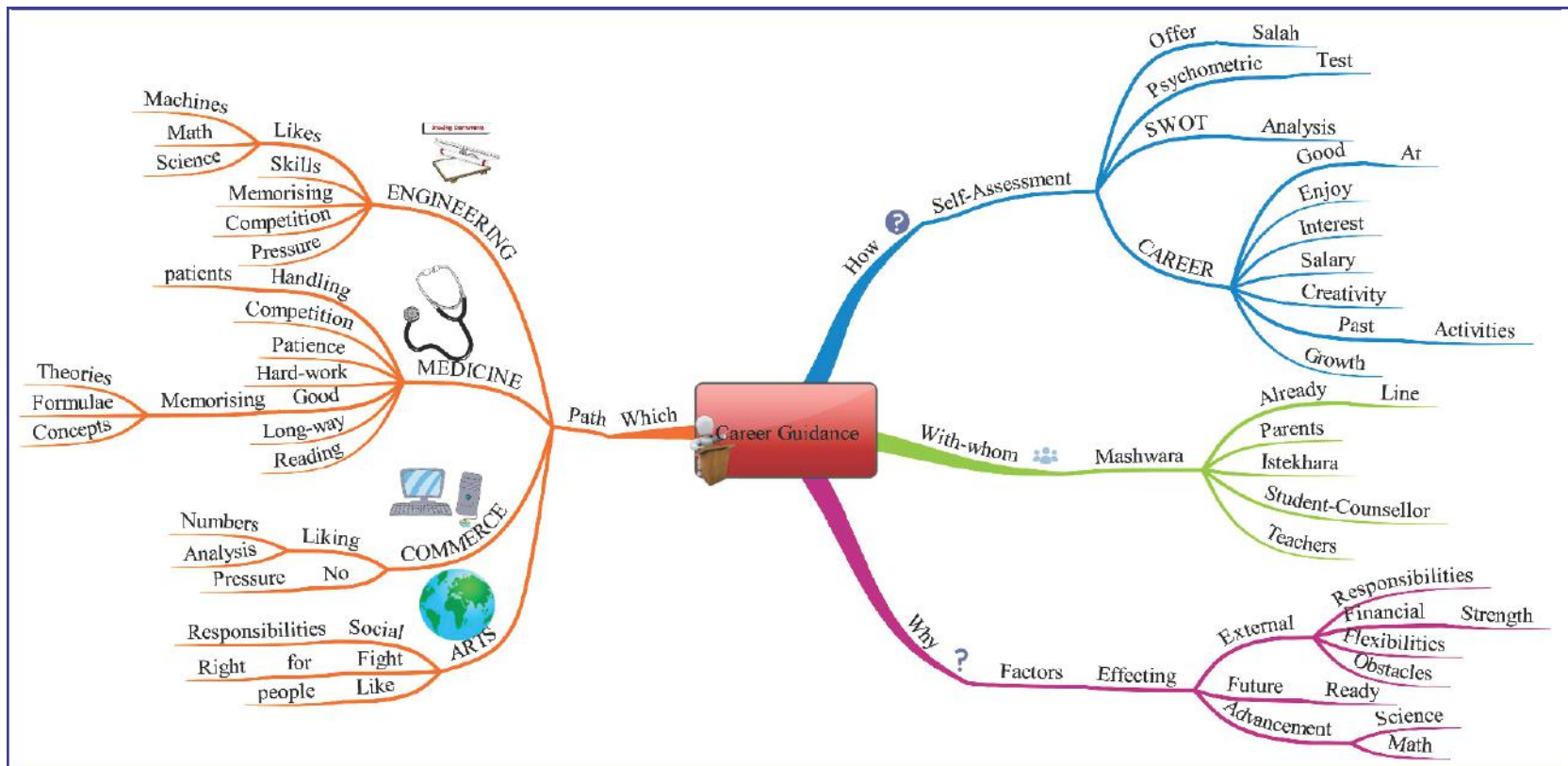


him. He knocked the troll right OFF the bridge, and those goats were never bothered by the troll again!

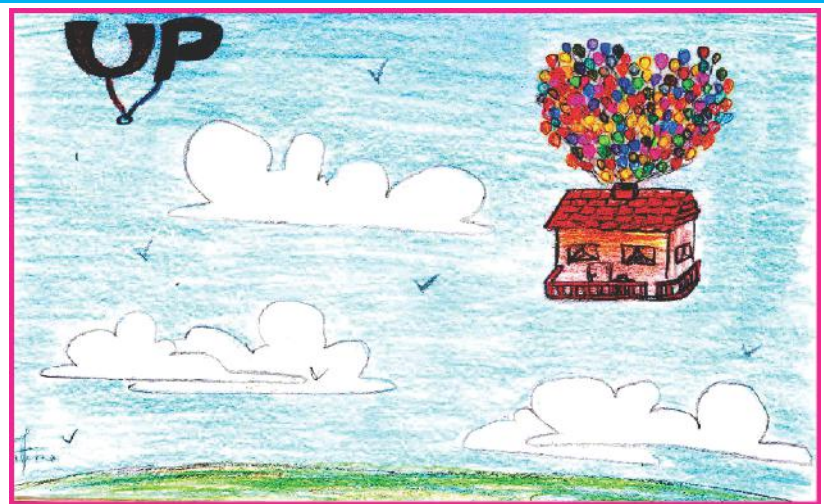

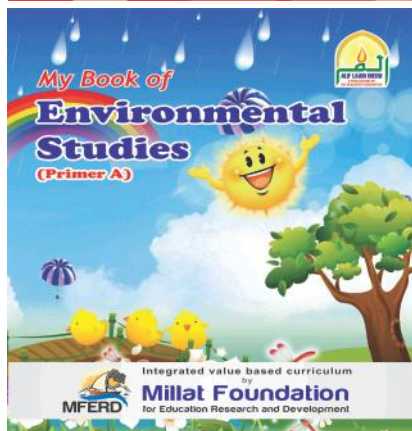
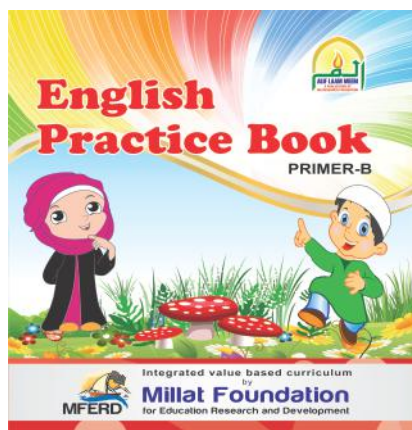
MFERD textbooks are in High demand in South and North Indian schools

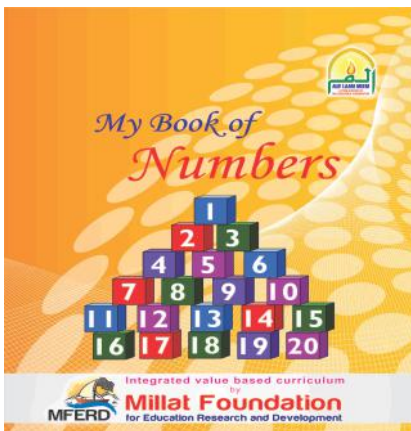
