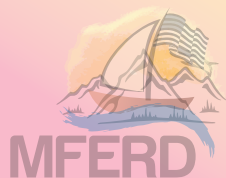

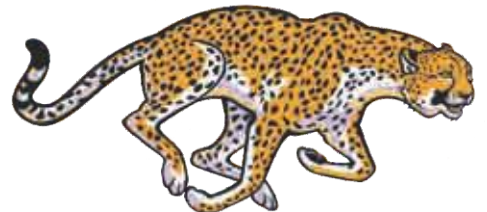

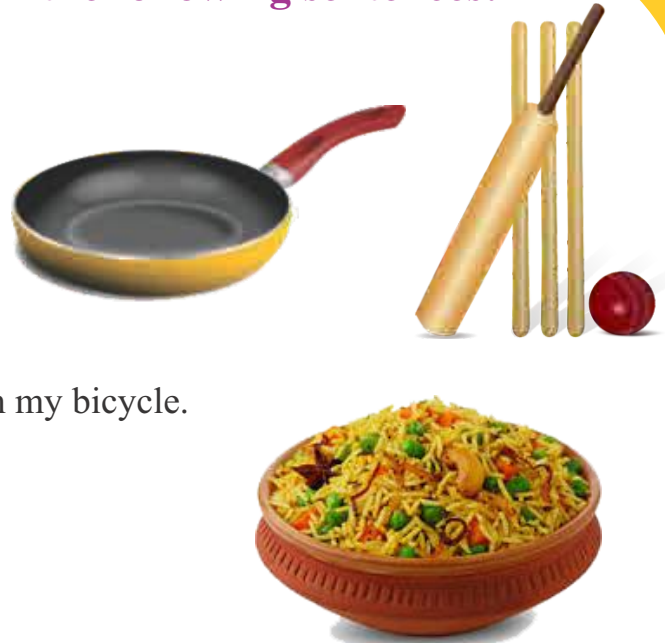

Types of Nouns

Proper noun: Name of a particular person, animal or thing is called a proper noun. They begin with capital letters.

Ex: London, Rizwan, Monday, Charminar

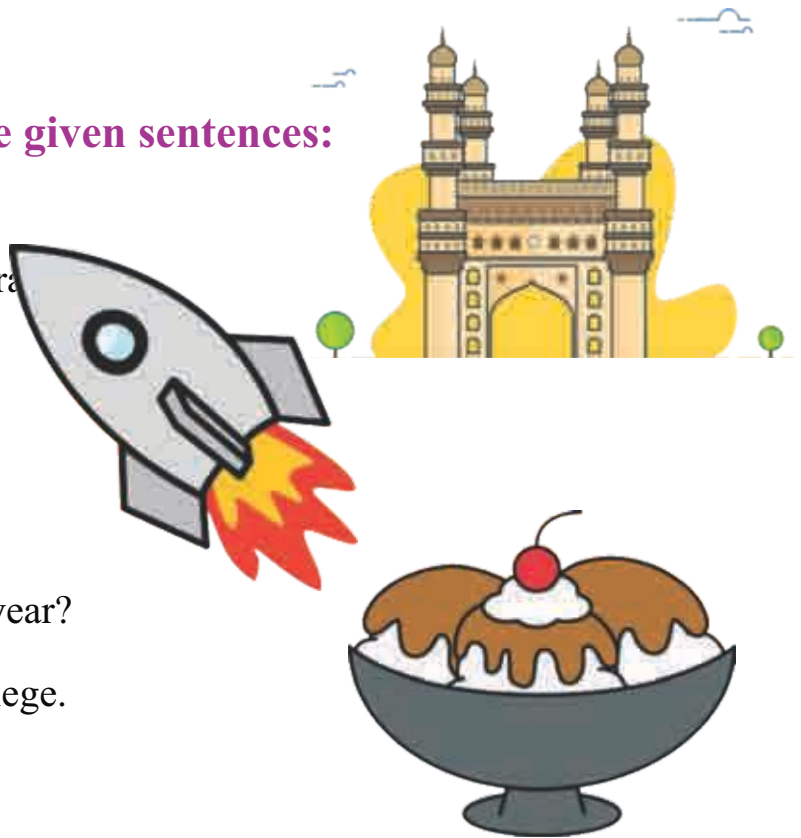

Countable noun: Anything that can be counted, whether singular or plural is a countable noun. Countable nouns are individual people, animals, places, things, or ideas which can be counted.

Ex: dogs, candles, hotels, cakes, books, boys

Uncountable noun: Anything that cannot be counted is an uncountable noun.

They are always singular and are used with singular verbs.

Ex: water, garbage, intelligence, cheese, bread

Common noun: Common nouns are general names of persons, animals, places, things or ideas.

Collective noun: Collective nouns are names for a collection or a number of people or things. They are words for single things that are made up of more than one person, animal, place or thing.

Ex: group, herd, pack, family, gang, crowd, flock, crew, pile, stack
