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Types of Nouns

Proper noun: Name of a particular person, animal or thing is called a proper

noun. They begin with capital letters.

Ex: London, Rizwan, Monday, Charminar

Countable noun: Anything that can be counted, whether singular or plural is a countable noun. Countable nouns are individual people, animals, places, things, for ideas which can be counted.

Ex: dogs, candles, hotels, cakes, books, boys+

Ex: group, herd, pack, family, gang, crowd, flock, crew, pile, stack
