Wisdom Infinite

Are we teaching 21st century skills to our students through Science?

Few years ago, when I was teaching the concept of centripetal and centrifugal force to grade 10 students, I noticed that students had become disengaged and had mere interest in the class. I stopped my explanation and tossed a question at the students, "how many of you enjoy the annual carnival on the exhibition ground at Nampally?" Now, they were all ears and I could see the spark of excitement even in the eyes of sleepy heads.

I continued by explaining that the stunt performers ride bikes on the vertical walls by maintaining an equilibrium between the centripetal and the centrifugal force. This maintains a particular velocity which moves the bike in a circle. Now, the questions start pouring in, *What if? How?* and so on. The class which was gloomy and uninteresting few minutes ago, now turned into a room full of enthusiasm with just **"excite and engage" strategy.**

How many of us who teach science motivate the students to think about science as something more than a body of facts and terms to memorize? For many decades, science education reformers have promoted the idea that learners should be engaged in the excitement of science. They should be helped to discover the value of evidence-based reasoning and higher-order cognitive skills, and be taught to become innovative problem solvers.

We as teachers must train our students to think out of the box to promote divergent thinking process. To bring creativity into the classroom, the teachers must have a deeper exposure to the content which helps in the encouragement of idea generation and making questioning a part of the daily classroom exchange.

Moreover, if students are to use creative thinking, they need motivation to do so. I

believe that the will to think creatively about a science problem is connected to the interest inherent in the topic. **The teachers can spark an interest by engaging them in hands-on activities or applications of the concepts in the real-life situations revolving around environmental or human needs familiar to the students.**

Additionally, the teachers can motivate the students by relating stories of inventors and innovators in that field by giving a touch of "real-world" experience. The teachers must promote inquiry questions from observations like *Why? What if? and How can?* and promote imaginative thinking among students until they become independent creative thinkers. **Children are naturally curious about science, then why don't we nurture that?**
