MS launches mobile app to keep parents updated

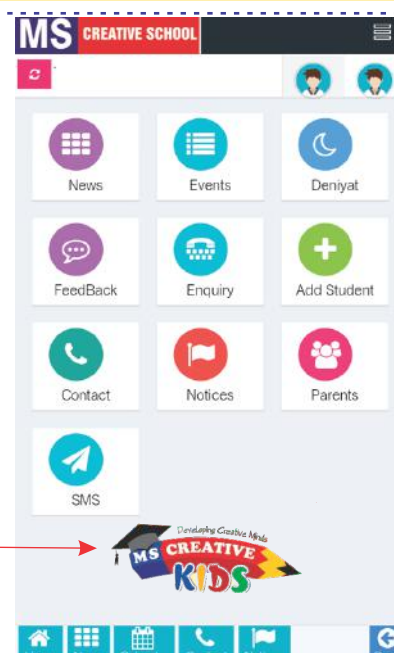

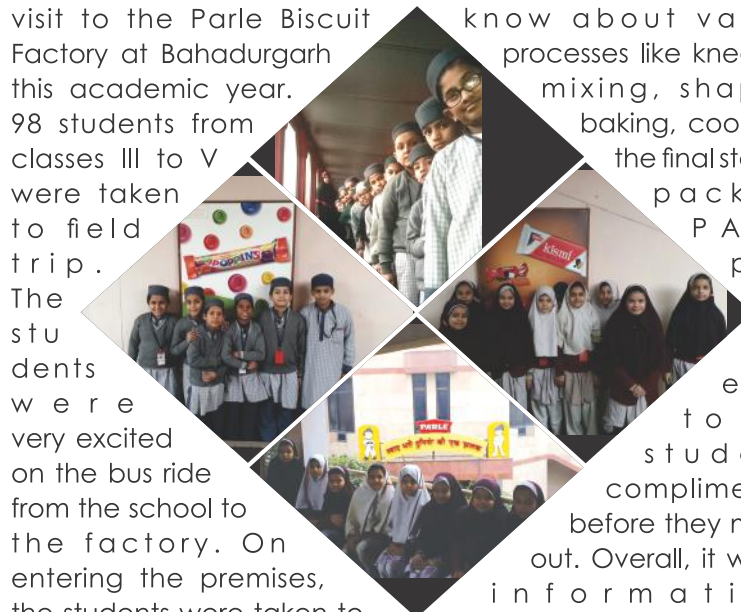
