




MSians participation in Painting competition


8th class drew painting on Swach Bharat 4) Jasiya Sultana and 5) Ayesha Fathima of 9th class drew paintings on Digital India.



















Soft skills workshop for College MSians

Mir Ahmed Ali is a class 9 student of Shahalibanda branch. He had also won gold at the district level Karate championship.



Syed Misbahuddin conferred honorary doctorate


