Parenting a 21st Century Child

Parenting is an art in itself, a marathon and more of a challenge. There are several ways parents can help children learn everything, from necessary self-care to more complicated social skills:

Parent-child communication is a complex blend of non-verbal emotional signals, words, and behaviour. Patterns of interaction are set even before a child can produce words himself or herself.

The mirror concept is appropriate with parenting what you give to them you will, in turn, receive that in your future. For example, when you smile you can see a smiling face, similarly, if you provide love, care to the child, you will also get love and care in future when you are alone and require that in your life.

Here are a few tips which a skilled parent should know:

Listening: Your child is trying out his/her new language. Give him/her your attention. Encourage your child to talk to you, sit beside him/her, they'll find it easier to speak and listen to you if you're not standing over them.

Feelings: Help them find the words to tell you how they are feeling, even if it takes time.

Explaining: If you have to say 'no', give your child a good reason and offer an alternative – "Juveria is playing with the doll now, let's find you another toy."

Join in: Once you've got everything out of the way, take

five minutes to get into what your child is doing – show them that what they're doing is important.

Instruction: Teaching through instructions works only when the child is listening. It is even better if the child is looking at the parents while they speak.

- The language used should be understandable by the child.

- Explanations should be exact, short, simple, and clear what we want the child to do.

Modelling: Teaching through observation.

- By watching adults, children learn what to do and how to do it.

- The challenge of being the significant role model for our children is to demonstrate behaviour we value and like.

- Parents and adults should avoid behaviour they don't like or don't want to encourage in their children.

Shaping: Teaching by approximation

- Family discussions in which decisions, rules, and expectations are explained help the adolescent to understand social systems and social relationships. This understanding plays an integral part in the development of reasoning abilities, role taking, moral judgment, and empathy — the verbal give-and-take characteristic of parent-child exchanges.

The psychology behind gaming deciphered!

Why do we play Games?

People play games in the state of boredom, when celebrating togetherness, to feel relaxed, have fun or just to spare time. But are these the only reasons why they play games? There has to be a reason why millions of people around the world spend hours of their day playing video games. Core factors that motivate us to play games are *achievement, interest and competition*. According to the *Self Determination Theory*, human behaviours are driven by the need for *competence, autonomy, and relatedness*. If those needs are met, we enjoy activities further. The flow of the game from easy to hard levels, holds the mental focus and promotes competence and also the challenges in games hold one's interest. Autonomy is met because we have control over the game and we voluntarily play games. Lastly, we can get connected with other people and compete with them in a virtual world that's different from real life.

Games designed with all these elements hold an individual's mental state and make him/her vulnerable to become gaming-addict.

What happens to our brain?

You might have noticed that the people who are completely engrossed in playing games, behave rudely when they are asked to stop playing. This is because different regions in their brain get activated when they are involved in playing games. And when they suddenly have to stop playing the game, the dopamine in their brain and the adrenaline in their body begin to ebb. Hence the people tend to lose focus.

Stress hormones also remain high, however, making it difficult for them to relax or think clearly. This leads to a path of aggressive behaviour. Thus, the resulted behaviour reflects in the form of *aggressiveness, irritation and violence*.

Gaming creates adverse effects which are mostly related to the time of play and the content of the game. But gaming with controlled use can also have positive impact on the brain.

World Health Organisation has recently introduced a term '**Gaming Disorder**' in the 11th revision of International Classification of Diseases (ICD-11). People who prefer excessive gaming over daily activities suffer from this disorder.

REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION

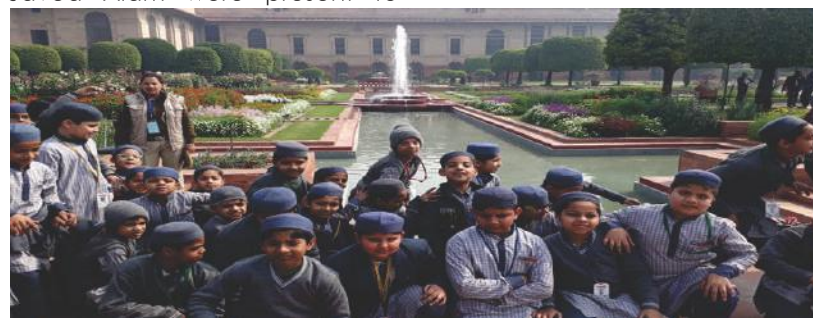
