- Keep a day as '<u>Sharing Day</u>' and encourage your child to share something with those who are in need, Let them decide whom they want to help.


Eg: pencils, books, toys etc.

This activity improves their personality and cultivates/nurtures the habit of sharing and helping others.


Engage your child in the following Fine Motor activities:


- Zipping and unzipping

- Colouring the boarder and making the worksheet colourful.






































HOLIDAY FUN!

Activity 2 - Counting Activity	 Cupcake liners/ paper plate Marker Pompoms or similar Tongs or tweezers (optional) 	Just write the numbers 1–12 in order in the bottom of the cupcake liners/ paper plate and get started with your little one dropping in the appropriate number of pom poms in each place.		
Activity 3 - Guess the word game	Write some sight words and family words on the chits. Mix all the word chits and throw them on the floor. Everyone will pick up one chit and read it aloud. They can also write the same words in a rough book. Along with reading, writing skills are improved too. You can replace the old words with the new words every week.
