The Supreme Court of India

Judiciary is one of the important organs of democracy. It wields enormous power and keeps a keen eye on the functioning of other two organs, namely executive and legislature. India has a unified judicial system with three-tier structure, i.e. Supreme Court, High Courts and Subordinate Courts, (or District Courts). The Supreme Court of India is at the top of this hierarchy.

Intro: The Supreme Court of India is the highest judicial court in India. It came into existence on 26th January 1950. The Supreme Court of India is also the final court of appeal under the Constitution of India, the highest constitutional court, with the power of judicial review, the guarantor of the fundamental rights of the citizens and the guardian of the Constitution.

It is a Constitutional body which is laid down in Part V of Chapter V of the Constitution of India from Articles 124 to 147.

Power: The law declared by the Supreme Court is binding on all courts within the territory of India. Under its judicial review power, the Supreme Court can strike down the legislative and executive action contrary to the provisions of the constitution, the distribution of power between Union and States or contrary to the fundamental rights guaranteed by the Constitution.

Composition: The Supreme Court of India comprises of the

Chief Justice and 33 other Judges appointed by the President of India. The original Constitution of 1950 envisaged a Supreme Court with a Chief Justice and 7 puisne Judges - leaving it to Parliament to increase this number. Parliament increased the number of Judges from 8 in 1950 to 11 in 1956, 14 in 1960, 18 in 1978, 26 in 1986 and 30 in 2009.

Qualification: In order to be appointed as a Judge of the Supreme Court, a person should have the following qualifications: He should be a citizen of India. 2) He should have been a judge of a High Court (or high courts in succession) for five years; or 3) He should have been an advocate of a High Court (or High Courts in succession) for ten years; or 4) He should be a distinguished jurist in the opinion of the president. 5) The Constitution has not prescribed minimum age for appointment as a judge of the Supreme Court.

Impeachment: A Judge of the Supreme Court cannot be removed from office except by an order of the President passed after an address in each House of Parliament supported by a majority of the total membership of that House and by a majority of not less than two-thirds of members present and voting, and presented to the President in the same Session for such removal on the ground of proved misbehaviour or incapacity.

Number of Supreme Court judges reach to 34

With the appointment of four new judges in September 2019, the total strength of judges in apex court is now 34 (including Chief Justice of India).

The Supreme Court judicial strength increased following the enactment of Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Bill of 2019 into law.

Background

Originally, the Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Act, 1956 provided for a maximum number of 10 judges (excluding CJI). This strength was increased to 13 by Amendment Act, 1960, and to 17 in 1977.

In 1986, the strength was increased to 25 (excluding CJI). Later, the Amendment Act, 2009 further augmented the strength of SC from 25 to 30.

The inspiring story of Fathima Beevi: India's first woman SC judge

This story is about a determined lady who broke all the barriers of societal biases to take up a profession that was once considered to be a man's prerogative. Justice Fathima Beevi is a name permanently etched into Indian history, and every judicial professional is familiar with her.

Fathima Beevi scripted history when she was appointed as the first female judge to be a part of the Supreme Court of India. She has many laurels under her cap. She was also the first Muslim woman to be appointed in Higher Judiciary echelon and the first woman to become a Supreme Court Justice in an Asian country.

She started her career as an

advocate and then became a judge of the Supreme Court. After retirement in 1992, she served as a member of the National Human Rights Commission. In 1997 she was appointed as the Governor of Tamil Nadu.

Born on April 30, 1927, in the erstwhile Travancore town of Pathanamthitta (Kerala), Fathima Beevi did her schooling from Catholicate High School, Pathanamthitta and got her B.Sc. from University College, Thiruvananthapuram. She obtained her B.L. from Government Law College, Thiruvananthapuram. In 1950, she became the first woman to top the Bar Council's examination. In the same year, she had enrolled as an advocate and started her legal

career from the lower court of Kerala.

In 1958 she was appointed as the Munsiff in the Kerala Subordinate Judicial Services. Then she was promoted as the Subordinate Judge in 1968 and as the Chief Judicial Magistrate in 1972, as District & Sessions Judge in 1974.

She was further appointed as the Judicial Member of the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal in January 1980. She was then elevated to the High Court as a Judge on 4 August 1983. She became permanent Judge of the High Court on 14 May 1984. In 1989 she was further elevated to the Supreme Court as a Judge and from where she retired on 29 April 1992.

Story of modern day Rupee

The modern day rupee owes its origin to "Rupaya, a silver coin issued by Sher Shah Suri in 1540-1545.

This silver coin remained in use during the Mughal period, Maratha era and British India. The silver coin weighed 178 grains and was the precursor of the modern rupee. It remained largely unchanged till the early 20th Century. Together with the silver Rupaya were issued gold coins called the Mohur weighing 169 grains and also copper coins called Dam.

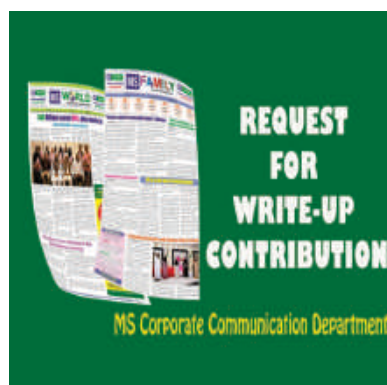

Learning Difficulty

Many children struggle in school with various challenges and one of it is learning issues. Learning issues doesn't define child's Intelligence; irrespective of good IQ few children still suffer from learning issues which is known as learning Difficulty/ Disorder. Many children struggle in school with such challenges.

What is learning difficulty (LD)?

If any child is trying his/her best to learn certain skills like reading, writing and doing math, but is not able to do. Then he/she might be having Learning Difficulty.

LD is a neurological condition where the brain is wired differently and this difference affects the ability to receive process, organize and produce the information. This is caused by various reasons such as heredity, Complications during birth, Exposure to high levels of toxins and psychological trauma.

What are the types of learning difficulties?

The most common types of learning difficulties are:

Dyslexia (problem in reading): difficulty perceiving a word as a combination of distinct sounds which makes difficult for child to understand how a letter or letters represent a sound and how letter combinations make a word, slow in reading, breaks the word into letter to read.

Dyscalculia (problem in math): Which cause problems

with the following skills: Understanding how numbers work, Calculations, Using math symbols, Organizing and recording information while solving a math problem

Dysgraphia (problem in Writing): Difficulty in written expression which may cause the following: Slow handwriting, handwriting which is poorly organized and hard to understand, spelling, grammar and punctuation error.

What the parent can do to handle such issues?

Psychologist speaks:

If your child has learning issues, it doesn't mean he/she can't learn. But you'll need to provide some extra help and support.

- Don't make you child demotivated and make them believe that they are not dumb.
- Encourage child to focus on his/her special talent and skills
- Children who have problems learning can reach their goals by developing different ways of learning for which the professional can help.
- If the child gets assessed by the professional (Psychologist or Special Educator) at the right time you will be on the right track in providing the intervention and remedial training.

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Child Behavioural Issues

School environment is an important part of an individual's life. This is where he learns to socialize and communicate. After family, school is the second most important place for an individual's overall development.

Sign of Normality

If a child is successful in communicating positively with people around him and acquires age and class appropriate skills like reading and writing. It is considered normal.

Sign of Abnormality

However, Pre-primary / Pre-schoolers and Primary / School going children show some behaviour that hinders their communication which in turn

affects their education as well. This behaviour that prevents the child from developing social skills, getting education and negatively affects his overall wellbeing is called BEHAVIORAL ISSUE. However, there can be many reasons for a child to misbehave or act differently.

Behavioural Issues

Behavioural Issues are the types of behaviour that are socially unacceptable. A child having behavioural issue/problem will not be open to learn new skills or apply his current skills. For example – if a child is good at eating food by himself, he will either stop eating or deliberately throw it away. What are the causes of Behavioural Issues?

Unhealthy family environment,

poor eating and sleeping habits, over disciplined or not disciplined at all, cartoon characters, teacher - student relationship are few of the factors that contribute to behavioural problems.

If a child has behavioural issue he should be guided in a right way and an expert should be consulted if needed.

How to handle this issue?

The first step to dealing with non-cooperation, tantrums, aggression and meltdowns is to understand what is causing the child to behave differently.

Try to find the triggers of misbehaviour, neglect negative behaviour occasionally, set rules and boundaries, give them

responsibility, reward good behaviour, be consistent, be



patient.

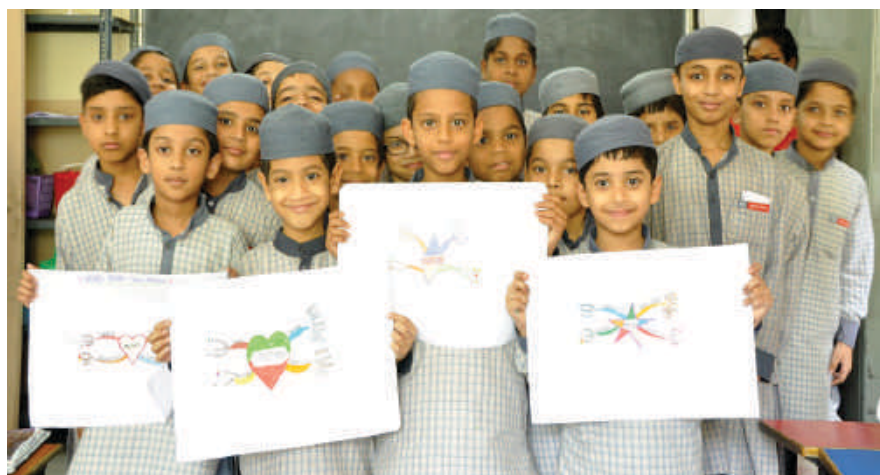
